We continue to foster the joy of reading at school with an extra emphasis this month. The Poly Drive PTA is once again sponsoring Poly Readers for students in first through fifth grades. Students will need to register by February 12th to attend a grade level book club during their lunch time every Thursday starting on February 27th for 4 weeks. Parent volunteers will be leading the book discussions. Thank you PTA for offering this great opportunity to our students.

Letters were mailed out on how to set an account up. If you need help, please contact the office. Back to school forms will all be on-line. Class lists will not be posted in August, instead, you will be able to see your child's teacher by logging on to your account in August.



Did you know:

The person who bullies purposefully misuses his/her power (size, age, popularity, confidence, verbal ability), usually repeatedly. The balance of power between the bully and target is NOT EQUAL.
